What is the Arboretum?

Before it was a Nature Center, the property occupied by Merryspring was once a homestead site, a sheep farm, and most recently, a sawmill and lumber yard. Many thousands of board-feet of mature white spruce, red spruce, and white pine were felled from these grounds. The resulting clear-cut let in sunlight and awakened the dormant seeds of many different species. Over time, birds, mammals, and the winds brought other wild seeds to the area When the property was purchased in 1974, Merryspring's founders recognized this forest diversity and protected some of the best and most interesting trees for this Arboretum.

Today, the Kitty Todd Arboretum serves as one of the most diverse habitats at Merryspring. Here you'll find 35 native Maine tree species among the dozens of other species of shrubs and wildflowers.

Finding Trees and Shrubs in the Arboretum

The map on the reverse side shows the approximate locations of 35 different species of trees and shrubs that are labeled in the Kitty Todd Arboretum. Simply match the key number of the species you are looking for (listed by common name) to the number on the map, walk down the appropriate trail, and keep a lookout for the colorful plant descriptions on wooden posts. In cases where the specimen is a ways off the trail, you'll see a small footpath which leads to the tree or shrub in question. Good luck!
